

Russian school

Children start going to school at the age of 6 in Russia. Before starting going to school ,they should attend lessons to get prepared for school. It is not necessary for them, but if parents don't want them to be worried at the first class ,they send them there or teach children them self at home. But to make sure their children feel comfortable in the first grade their children to the preparatory classes or they can teach them themselves



School starts on the first day of September. Most children bring to school flowers for teachers. Classes from 1 to 4 are called primary school. Children are taught by only 1 teacher except for such lessons as PE and music.



Children's performance will depend on their activities and grades for their homework in class discussions, homework. During the brake they can have lunch, relax and communicate with each other.



There are many different clubs. If you are sporty, you can play football, basketball or ping pong. If you prefer something different, there are many things to do such as needlework club or become a member of a school board.



Primary schools work 5 days a week ,children have 4 lessons a day. Pupils don't get a lot of homework ,it usually takes an hour. After 4 classes children go to high school, where they start studying hard.



In the 9th form everyone has to sit for exams to continue studying at school. Some children can leave school and continue their education at vocation schools.



Every student has to choose subjects he needs to enter university. The last exam they take is Russian National Exam.
